



- ▶ Peru claims almost 4,000 different varieties of potatoes! Scientists in Peru even tested a variety of potato that would be resilient enough to grow on Mars!
- ▶ The mysterious Nazca lines are hundreds of HUGE geoglyphs that were etched into the ground of the Peruvian desert between 500 BC and 500 AD. Geoglyphs illustrate living creatures, plants, imaginary beings, and geometric figures several kilometers long which make it easier to view from the sky!
- ▶ Three-quarters of the world's alpaca population lives in Peru. Its wool is considered the world's most luxurious fabric, and comes in 22 natural colors.
